# LPEA Round Up Foundation Board awards \$42,355 in funding to local non-profits in Q2 2023

DURANGO, Colo. – The LPEA Round Up Foundation Board granted \$42,355 in funding to local non-profit organizations at its April, May, and June 2023 meetings. These grants are part of the board's ongoing efforts to improve the quality of life in our community. Since the beginning of 2023, the board has approved 28 grants amounting to \$76,195. The grants aim to advance and support non-profit causes within La Plata and Archuleta counties.

Round Up Grants are made possible by the generosity of La Plata Electric Association (LPEA) members, who choose to round up their electric bill each month to the next highest dollar. So far, approximately 16,986 LPEA members have donated \$59,771 to the Round Up Foundation in 2023. Each month \$5,000 in <u>Unclaimed Capital Credits</u> totaling \$60,000 annually is also allocated by the LPEA Board of Directors to support Educational Grants.

A percentage of Round Up Foundation funds is also distributed to community assistance programs each year. In 2023, the Round Up Foundation allocated \$12,442 to the <u>Community Emergency Assistance Coalition</u> and \$4,131 to the <u>Pagosa Outreach Connection</u> to provide families and individuals with emergency assistance funds.

Grants are available to registered 501(c)(3) non-profit organizations in La Plata and Archuleta counties and usually range from \$500 to \$5,000. Application forms are available at lpea.coop/grant-programs.

LPEA members wishing to round up their bill can sign up on <u>SmartHub</u> or at <u>lpea.coop/round-foundation</u>. The average LPEA member contribution is just \$6.00 annually. Members can also elect to donate more each month if they would like to contribute additional money to local non-profits automatically.

Established in 1997, the La Plata Electric Round Up Foundation is a non-profit, community-support fund for organizations and individuals in LPEA's service territory. A local, elevenmember volunteer board reviews applications and allocates funds. 100% of the tax-deductible donations stay in the communities LPEA serves.
